




Spotlight School Results

Continuous Improvement

Strategic Plan objectives are accomplished through repeated use of Continuous Improvement methods. The Hurst-Euless-Bedford ISD began using the Continuous Improvement approach in 2004. This means the District uses research and data as part of decision making, from the board room to the classroom.

Continuous Improvement Methods

Continuous Improvement means HEB is constantly seeking to improve processes and outcomes. HEB approaches every interaction each day with an attitude of "how can we make this better?" HEB uses data and research, along with expertise, to implement improvements that are efficient and effective. HEB has trained all campuses and departments on how to implement continuous improvement (see below).

The results speak for themselves. In 2004, HEB ISD had 15 "Recognized" campuses and 12 "Academically Acceptable" campuses, with no "Exemplary" campuses. In 2014, 100% of our campuses Met Standards, and 68% achieved academic distinctions exceeding most of our peer districts. It is clear that applying Continuous Improvement methods produces results, which means success for every child.
